

What are I/GCSE courses?

International / General Certificate of Secondary Education.

- Taken in over 125 countries with a choice of over 60 subjects.
- Challenging and rigorous.
- Allow for breadth of study and specialisation.
- Natural progression onto A levels.
- 2 year courses over years 10 & 11.
- Can be coursework or examination only based.



Our I/GCSE courses

- We offer a range of 4 'Compulsory' subjects and 4 'Option' subjects.
 - A total of 10 examinations can be gained.
 - Graded 9-1
 - Grade 4 as a 'standard pass'
 - Grade 5 as a 'strong pass'



Progression to Sixth Form

- Students need to achieve at least five grades that are grade 5 or higher.
- This includes a grade 5 or higher in English & Maths.
- Students are expected to achieve a grade 6 or higher in subjects they want to study at AS Level.
- Entry could require four grade 6's <u>plus two</u> grade 5's in English & Maths.

Courses for September 2022

Compulsory subjects

- English language and literature
- Mathematics
- Science (double award)
- A core language (French OR German)
- Physical Education (not examined)
- Personal development (PDV) (not examined)



English language and literature

- IGCSE English Language and IGCSE English Literature with Edexcel Exam Board, both graded 9-1
- These run together and 2 x IGCSEs are awarded.
- IGCSE English Language and IGCSE English Literature are taught within the same timetable slot.

Head of Faculty is Mr Willsher.



Mathematics

- All students will take an IGCSE in Mathematics with the Edexcel examboard.
- Students will either take either the foundation or higher tier paper.
- A minimum grade of 7 on the higher paper will allow progression onto the AS/A2 courses.
- An additional IGCSE qualification Further Mathematics, can be selected as an option.

Head of Faculty is Dr Plant.



Science – double award

- Students take the IGCSE double award in Science.
- The course includes Biology, Chemistry & Physics components.
- The double award is worth 2 x IGCSE's.
- Students will take either the core or the extended paper.
- The extended double award enables students to progress onto any (or all) of the sciences AS/A2 level.
- Majority of English schools offer the double award.
- Students will be taught the 3 disciplines of Biology, Chemistry & Physics separately.

Head of Faculty is Mr Stenton.



Modern Foreign Languages

- One CORE language has to be taken either French or German.
- Students wishing to study both languages can select a second language as one of their option choices.
- There is the possibility to take a language exam as an additional qualification in a mother tongue language such as Spanish if the students are fluent. The examination will be First Language with CAIE (only reading and writing).
- Students may also sit the exam in the language they drop in year 10 if they are fluent / native speakers (advanced students with higher level).

- Physical Education (PE).
- **PDV**, a tutorial package that includes: Spiritual, Moral, Social & Cultural education.

Transition Management KS3/4

- **Taster lesson week:** year 9 students had this week of GCSE taster lessons. These were lessons looking at syllabi, schemes of work, past exam papers and work by the current I/GCSE students.
- **This evening:** Help and guidance to select the right option subjects. Staff and students are here to discuss with students and parents the suitability of the option subjects chosen.
- Curriculum guides: available to view on the schools website and download from the parent portal.
- September 2022: Early identification of any issues.
- Progress check in the first term.
- Up to 4 weeks to change options. Time to reflect and decide if the course is suitable.

- 19 to 22 April Individual options meetings with staff
- Friday 22 April Preliminary options form 'Live' on Teams
- Friday 29 April Preliminary options form closes
- Early May Students informed of final option blocks



Reasons For Choosing A Subject

- You have a strong interest in the subject.
- You are good at it and committed to improvement.
- It is required for A Level, then the university course you want to follow.
- If you already know what or where you want to study after A Levels, it is a good idea to look up the websites of the universities to see if they require certain subjects.
- NOT because your friends are doing it, you like the teacher or think it's an 'easy' option.



Academic Monitoring

- Guidance to choice of courses and settling in period.
- Target setting CAT4.
- Tutor time / PDV programme including careers guidance.
- Support programme for students under-performing.
- Regular assessment and reporting, including progress checks.
- Provision for MA&T.
- Mock exams.
